Summer (2) Newsletter 2025





We are all ready for a well-deserved rest over the summer holidays.

We finish on Friday 18th July, 2025 and return to school on Wednesday 3rd September, 2025.



This half term we have had topic fortnight. All classes were able to select themes and topics suited to their children's needs and interests.

In Bees, KS1 pupils focused on 'Castles and Craft' which links in with their summer term 'We Are Britain' History and Art topics. They have learnt about life and jobs in a medieval castle and made junk model castles. They also visited Stafford Castle.

In Hedgehogs pupils focused on 'Magnets and Compasses' which links in with their summer term Science and Geography topics. They visited Jodrell Bank to support their work on Space and also visited the Synagogue in Trent Vale and the Mosque in Hanley to support with their learning in RE. On top of all of that they have ticked off some of the Hopedale 50 challenges: fruit picking, visit a castle and a picnic in the park.

In Butterflies, they have focused on completing some of the Hopedale 50 activities. They had lots of fun making potions, having a picnic and visiting a farm. They have also spent time focusing on D&T creating their own tie dye pillowcases and creating their own bird boxes.

In Squirrels, the children have learnt about the 5 oceans and 7 continents of the world. They have learnt about the different layers of the ocean, the ecosystems they contain and the different types of creatures that live in the ocean. They have learnt which countries belong in each continent and the habits they contain. Alongside this, the children have explored the country that we live in and the locality of their homes.





In Robins pupils have worked on building friendships and relationships with key links to PSHE & social skills. They have completed baking, gift making, team building and created their own stories and created their very own friendship board game.

In Dragonflies, pupils have focussed on completing as many of the Hopedale 50 events as possible! They have created their own potions before going offsite to visit a farm. They also created their own music using AI and designed and created a CD case to go with it. They have also designed and flown kites as well as built their own dens!

In Ladybirds, pupils have covered sports and religion as well as home cookery. They have been looking at food hygiene and the importance of meal planning. They tried their hands at puff pastry chocolate twists, fruit skewers, fruit smoothies and cupcake baking. They finished their first week by attending Bearstone Fruit farm for some fruit picking. In Sport and Religion, they have been comparing faith and sport by designing a bold and expressive graffiti-style panel that connects a religious value with a sporting theme. As a class they have then looked at the importance of the Olympics and planned their very own Olympic activity for a class Mini Olympics event.

In Badger Cubs KS1 and KS2 pupils have continued to focus on English and Maths sessions, with a particular emphasis on phonics and shape and fractions. Pupils have also taken part in trips to a castle, Jodrell Bank, a Mosque and a Synagogue, enriching their learning through real-world experiences. They have also been working towards completing their Hopedale 50 challenges, proudly ticking off activities such as visiting a farm, fruit picking, and rolling down a hill – all contributing to a fun and memorable term.

In Badgers, KS2 pupils have continued to focus on English and Maths during their morning sessions. Specifically focussing on time, shape and decimals. In topic lessons they have focused on identifying key human and physical geographical features within the local area and wider world. This involved trips to Thor's cave and walks within the local area. During afternoon sessions pupils have explored the importance of food hygiene and safety regulations in the kitchen, they have baked some nice treats including banana bread, flapjacks and muffins. In the final week they have completed a short topic on graffiti, looking at the work of Banksy with pupils creating their own spray paint pieces of art.

In Owls & Foxes students have taken part in Independence Focus Fortnight. Taking part in a number of work experience placements in the school's bistro, supporting with takeouts and working in local charity shops and cafes. Pupils have also visited Reeseheath college and explored different courses. In addition to this, pupils have had the opportunity to develop their independent living skills; practicing shopping and cooking on a budget, learning travel skills and basic car maintenance and considered what managing a home entails. BTEC construction students have also developed their DIY skills and built a brick planter for our school garden.
