What a super half term it has been!

We are all ready for a well-earned rest over the half-term break.

We finish on Friday 9th February 2024 for the half term break and return to school on Monday

19th February 2024.

What have we been up to this half term?

The focus this half term has been on History.

In KS2, our pupils have focused on the Romans. They started by exploring how Rome was founded and then considered different Roman ruling systems and governance. They then researched what life was like for Roman soldiers and investigated various Roman artifacts.

In KS3, pupils have focused their studies on the First and Second World Wars. They began by considering Britain's place in the world at the turn of the twentieth century. They went on to identify the main areas of conflict within the wars and the short- and long-term causes of them. They concluded by considered the typical experiences of soldiers and how developments in modern warfare have affected them.

Launch of the Hopedale 50:

As you will be aware, our school moto is 'we work best, when we work together', and we pride ourselves in making that happen for our wonderful young people.

At Hopedale, we place value and emphasis on learning through shared experiences and making memories. The 'Hopedale 50' are 50 experiences we pledge to provide our students with during their time with us.

Each of the 50 activities have been chosen to bring smiles and pleasure from everyday experiences that many take for granted, but often form our childhood memories.

You will find the 'Hopedale 50' attached, they are displayed in every classroom and throughout the school as of our School Improvement Plan to enhance and enrich our student's journey with us.

The students have their progress tracked in their own Record of Achievement. These are updated as experiences occur and are documented with photographs.

When students complete their first 20 experiences, they will be awarded a bronze medal, for 35 they receive a silver medal and for completion of the full 50, a gold. Enrichment Days this half term:

Aspirational Day was a big success, with pupils dressing up in the job roles they aspire to have.
